OpenAIRE is an European-based nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting Open Science worldwide and improving the discoverability, accessibility, shareability, reusability, and reproducibility of data-driven research results, as well as their monitoring. The project is supported by a network of experts known as the *National Open Access Desks*, and is a leading implementer of the *European Open Science Cloud*.
